

Important State 4-H Horse Program Update

The North Carolina 4-H Horse Program will no longer require an annual enrollment card or the \$25 an annual enrollment fee.

In lieu of the enrollment fee, several state level 4-H Horse Program educational contests and sponsored events may have individual entry fees. Eligibility cards for the participation in the District and State 4-H Horse Show are still required and will be made available in December 2015.

New! - Painting Workshop

for ages 8 to 10

4-H'er Alana Merrell will offer a 2-session painting workshop on Fridays, November 6 and 13 from 3:30 - 5:00pm at the Extension Center learning lab. The workshop is limited to five participants ages 8 to 10 years old.

Alana has been into art "forever". For the past year she's studied with

Ann Dergara and has exhibited works at several galleries. Alana will provide instruction on the basics of acrylic painting starting with a blank canvas to finished product. The subject will be birds, as this is a good basic shape to start with. Participants will learn the principles of light, how to mix and layer colors, and brush techniques. Discover how fun and creative painting can be!

A fee of \$25/youth will cover the cost of all supplies: canvas, paint, brushes and palette knife. Registration and payment is due by Friday, October 30. Call 884-3109 to register. Checks may be made to TC CES.

New! 4-H Electric Workshop for 7th through 9th graders

Sign up now for experimenting with circuits, learning to solder, and building your own electric plant soil monitor! You'll also learn more about how electricity works to provide power in your home. This workshop will be led by Mr. Danny Shook on Monday afternoons November 2, 9, and 16 from 3:30 - 5:00 at the Extension Center. An additional session may be added on Nov. 23 if necessary to finish the project.

Those who complete the workshop series will be eligible to apply for a FREE TRIP including transportation to 4-H Electric Congress held in July at one of our state universities. Electric Congress includes meeting 4-H'ers from across NC, doing more electric projects and fun

tours of area attractions. Each county can send two delegates who complete a 4-H electric project report by January. Call 884-3109 to register. The workshop is limited to 8 participants. Cost is \$10/ youth. Registration and payment are due by Friday, October 16. Checks may be made to TC CES.


