Learn to protect your hemlocks!



Join the Hemlock Restoration Initiative at Christmount Conference Center for a workshop to learn the fundamentals of treating hemlock trees to protect them from the invasive insect, hemlock woolly adelgid (HWA). Today hemlock management is simpler and less expensive than ever before!

What does the workshop cover?

Participants will learn about a variety of methods to protect hemlocks through outdoor, hands-on practice and indoor presentations.

Topics covered will include:

- Assessing hemlock health
- Chemical application methods available to landowners
- The ecological importance of hemlocks and their place in urban and community forests
- The biology of HWA and other hemlock pests
- The specific details of chemical treatment
- The integration of biological, silvicultural, and other control methods
- When and how to seek professional tree care help

An optional session from 1 to 4 pm on Friday will cover biological control and monitoring for HWA-predator beetles.
